HISTORY

Founded in 1909 under a private trust from Delos F. Diggins, the Harvard Diggins Library is now over a century old.

Diggins grew up in Harvard, IL and wanted to give something of lasting value back to the community he loved. His gift provided money for the library building, but it was up to Harvard residents to supply the books to fill the shelves. These early library patrons set the model of community support and involvement that continues to this day.

Today, Harvard Diggins Library is considered a city library, and although property holders within the city limits pay taxes to support this library, it still relies partially on gifts, donations, grants, and fundraising to offer quality services, materials, and programs to the community.

Harvard Diggins Library accepts monetary donations of any size. Monetary gifts help the library tremendously in many ways. We do not accept VHS tapes, encyclopedias, textbooks, or Reader's Digest condensed books. Donations can be delivered to the Circulation Desk anytime during open hours.
