How many buttons and brag tags will you collect this summer?


As you read, you'll collect pinback buttons and brag tags of your favorite book covers. You'll also earn extra raffle tickets for attending the fun events included in this newsletter.

### LIBRARY CLOSING FOR PARKING LOT REPAIRS

In August, the Library's parking lot will be resurfaced. The existing asphalt will be replaced with a new 4-inch layer and the parking spaces restriped. Work is expected to begin Monday, August 5 and take one week to complete during which the parking lot will be closed to vehicle traffic. The Library will be closed beginning Monday, August 5 with plans to reopen on Monday, August 12. No library materials will be due the week of the closure. Please do not return materials until the library reopens on Monday, August 12. Weather and other factors may impact the project so keep track of what is happening on the Library's Facebook page and at www.harvard-diggins.org. The parking lot replacement project is funded through the Library's capital reserves.
